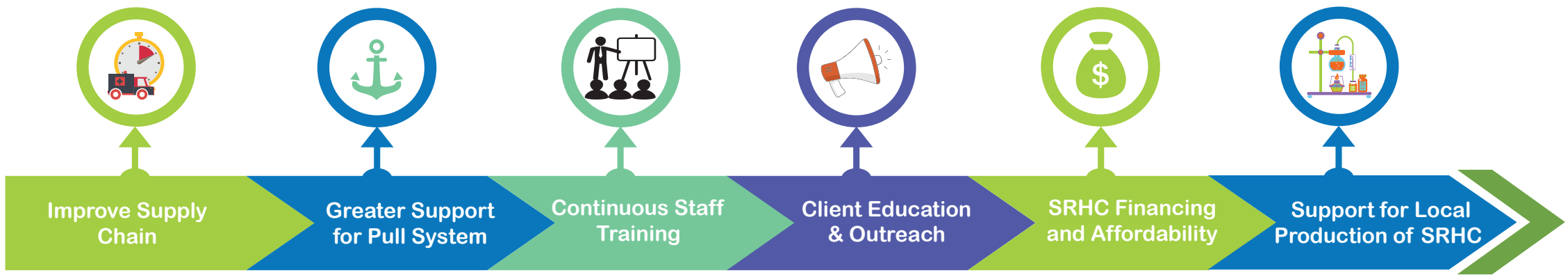


RECOMMENDATIONS TO IMPROVE ACCESS TO SEXUAL & REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH COMMODITIES (SRHC) IN KENYA



- Improve Supply Chain**
- Optimise logistics infrastructure
 - Speed up medicine requisition and delivery of medicines through training
 - Eliminate delay requisition, use of logistics forms and delivery of inadequate supplies
 - Ministry of Health and KEMSA to take lead in ensuring more efficient quantification system

- Greater Support for Pull System**
- More support of the recently adopted pull model, where deliveries are based on demand
 - Support for the initialized process of integratrating parallel i.e. reproductive health commodities into KEMSA's overall distribution process programs

- Continuous Staff Training**
- In collaboration with Kenya Medical Training College (KMTC), Nursing Council of Kenya, National and County government
 - Reliance on pharmacists to function as the supply chain managers in health facilities
 - Staff sensitization and continuous education

- Client Education & Outreach**
- Improving knowledge in the community about SRH. **56%** of clients are reluctant to access SRH services
 - Provision of information to FP clients' needs to be improved
 - Eliminate service providers behaviour of coercing clients to take up an FP method that is not of their choice through continuous training and supervision

- SRHC Financing and Affordability**
- Increase government funding and sufficient resource allocation
 - Prevent disbursement delays

- Support for Local Production of SRHC**
- Introduce tax incentive system as part of government contribution to universal access
